Fortunately for the rest of us, these skills combine and result in the beautiful music we hear at over thirty performances each season. The way that these boys learn these lessons - in an environment of achievement balanced with humility - is very much unlike any other organization. Thank you for all you do to support these choristers through this journey. I'm looking forward to a wonderful 2006-2007 season!

Movie nights, Frisbee golf, basketball, swimming, recreation time, art classes and projects, and evening activities rounded out the boys' very busy schedules!

# WARDROBE UPDATE

The CBC handbook outlines the performance wardrobe expectations for all choirs. In general, the CBC provides Handel and Concert Choirs with their full attire (tuxedo shirt, pants, vest, bowtie, shoes) and Schubert and Mozart with bowties and cumberbunds. Over the last several years we have lost a large number of vests and bowties costing the choir a considerable amount of money. In addition, with the large number of choristers in Handel and Concert Choirs this year (a great thing!!) we do not have enough vests for everyone. The choir will be purchasing new vests this year and at the same time will be implementing a new wardrobe policy to ensure that these vests will be available for choristers in the years to come.

- ▼ Beginning with the 2006-2007 season, all choristers in the Handel and Concert Choirs will be required to make a \$60 cash wardrobe deposit before any wardrobe pieces will be issued.
- ▼ \$50 of the deposit is refundable upon the return of all wardrobe items in good condition at the end of the season
- ▼ \$10 of the deposit is non-refundable and will be used for the maintenance and alterations of the cassocks and surplices
- ▼ Should any wardrobe item be lost, the value will be deducted from the deposit before any item is replaced
- ▼ Should items be outgrown during the year they must be returned before new items will be issued. The choir will no longer reimburse choristers for items purchased to replace outgrown clothing.

In addition to these changes, we will be emptying the wardrobe room of non-tuxedo items (black pants, white shirts, khaki shorts, etc). These items will be available for purchase at the parent meetings while they last. Once these items are gone we will implement an exchange program:

- ▼ If you have items that are outgrown contact the office with the details (what items, what size). Do not bring them in.
- ▼ The office will post available items on the website and on the bulletin board
- ▼ If you need an item, check the website and the bulletin board to see what is available. Contact the person who has the items to arrange an exchange.

The details will be in the new CBC handbook that you will receive at the first parent meetings. Let us know if you have any questions!

# Volunteer Program Changes

Volunteers are the heart of this organization. Anyone who has been backstage during the production of the Singing Christmas Tree knows very well that the show would not be the same (or more likely would not exist!) without the countless hours into which family and friends generously pour their time. The same is true during the rest of the year—greeters and those who help with receptions contribute tremendously to a concert evening. We have listened to feedback and are making some changes to the volunteer program. The following changes in the box below will be implemented.

While the volunteer requirement has increased by 30 points from last year, points are now being awarded for the time you spend in mandatory parent meetings as

well as for turning in forms and tuition on time. So, just by attending the first parent meeting, turning in the forms and tuition you will have earned 25 points already! And that's before the season officially starts! We know that many people do WAY more than 5 hours (50 points) at the Tivoli. Up to 5 additional hours (50 points) will now be credited toward your general volunteer hours. Finally, points are being awarded for your recruiting efforts. We will be holding auditions this fall for choristers to start in January—look for recruit forms in the office.

We appreciate your feedback and hope that you will be pleased with the changes we have made. Most of all, we THANK YOU for your time!

## The Changes in a Nutshell

- ▼ 120 general volunteer points required per family
- ▼ 50 Singing Christmas Tree points required per family
- ▼ up to 50 additional SCT points can be counted towards general point requirement
- ▼ 10 points per family for attendance at mandatory Parent meetings (4 per year)
- ▼ 5 points for turning in volunteer for
- ▼ 5 points for turning in information form
- ▼ 10 points for 2 doz. baked goods brought in for receptions
- ▼ 40 points for hosting a chorister from a visiting choir
- ▼ 25 points for the referral of a boy who auditions
- ▼ 50 points for referral of boy who joins

## Communications

There are several modes of communication that the CBC uses to inform you of events, performances, and other important information.

▼ **Parent Meetings** are held twice each semester. The dates for these meetings can be found in the calendar section of the manual and **attendance is mandatory**.

▼ **Weekly Memos** are published every Monday and are posted for review on the bulletin board in the hallway outside of the CBC office and on the CBC website in the member's section. They are also emailed weekly to everyone who has provided the office with an email address.

▼ **Monthly Newsletters** are published the first Monday of every month and are posted on the CBC website, emailed to everyone who has provided the office with an email address, and sent home with those choristers who do not have access to the internet.

▼ **Website** ([www.chattanoogaoychoir.org](http://www.chattanoogaoychoir.org)) The front page of the website contains information for the general public including the performance schedule, pictures of performances, and past and current newsletters. The members section is password protected (**p3canz**) and contains information pertinent to choristers and their families. In this section you will find all of the weekly memos (past and current), forms (camp, tour), directions and maps for upcoming concerts and much more. This is the first place you should look for information.

▼ We understand that there are some people who do not have access to the internet. If this is the case, please contact the office and we will make arrangements to get important information to you by other means. Please keep in mind that all information on the web can also be found on the weekly memos which are posted on the bulletin board in the hallway outside of the CBC office.
