Strong Roots

On January 29 and 30, members of the **CBC Handel Choir** performed at the Tivoli Theater with choirs from several area schools, talented soloists, and the Chattanooga Symphony and Opera Youth Orchestra in a production of *The Journey of Sir Douglas Fir*. The music-filled allegorical tale tells the story of a majestic Douglas fir tree which falls in the woods remarkably, without splitting or splintering. The once strong and proud tree wondered in doubt with his animal friends (among them were a bear, a robin, and a highly energetic squirrel) about his future. Knowing he could not be placed back into the ground, he worried about the possibilities of becoming a boat, or a church pew, or, as his friend Bully the Bear suggested, "a million teeny tiny toothpicks." After enjoying the encouragement of his friends, a thrilling train ride, and several twists and turns, the story ends in a grand fashion with Douglas proudly unveiled as...well, perhaps I'll let you find out the end yourself at a future performance!

I was particularly proud that our Handel Choir was able to perform on this program. Their experience in the CBC epitomizes the experience relayed in the story – that strong "roots" carry us through to success in all situations. The people these boys meet in Mozart Choir, the experiences they share while in Schubert Choir, and all the rest of their experiences build upon each other to equip them for success at every level.

Even though the Handel Choir members are not yet actively participating in the "most experienced" choir level, they certainly made a great showing at this event because of their training and experience. This element of education and training is such an important aspect of the CBC. It is the part of our mission that remains largely outside of the public eye, but it perhaps the most important thing we do.

The Chattanooga Boys Choir is supported in part by grants from the Tennessee Arts Commission, which is funded by the Tennessee Legislature. Did you know that a portion of the fee for **all** specialty license plates (not just the Arts plate) funds the Arts in Tennessee? It is important for us to let our elected officials know that continued funding of the arts in Tennessee is important to us, and we need your help. There are Advocacy Packets in the office that provide a guide for writing a brief note to elected officials and contain a listing of their addresses. Simply write a brief letter of thanks, sign it, and return it to the CBC office—we'll even mail it for you. Imagine the impact 120 letters might have! We'll make sure you get 5 volunteer points for each letter you write.
